

## Монголын Сүм Хийдийн Түүхэн Товчоо Төсөл

### UB 37 Tarbalin Khiid

Tibetan name: thar-pa gling

English name: Monastery of Liberation

The monastery is situated behind the Ulaanbaatar University.

Informant: Ariunbold, head of the monastery

The monastery was founded in 2008. It operated in three yurts covered with orange canvas until the new monastery was built in 2011. The monastery belongs to the Red Stream. Its head is Ariunbold who was born in Deren sum, Dundgovi aimag. He was a disciple of Sh. Banzar monk who trained him in Namdoldechenlin monastery in Bayankhoshuu. In 1999 the head founded a monastery in the 3rd district of Ulaanbaatar, but later they moved to the present site. At present the monastery has 30 monks. The main deities worshipped are Padmasambhava and Toinog (T. *khros nag*). The following ceremonies are held monthly: on the 10<sup>th</sup> Lowon chogo (T. *slob-dpon-gyi cho-ga*), on the 8<sup>th</sup> Narkhajid (T. *na-ro mkha'-spyod*), on the 15<sup>th</sup> Khand tseejüü (T. *mkha'-gro'i tshes-bcu*), on the 25<sup>th</sup> Khand tseejüü (T. *mkha'-gro'i tshes-bcu*), on the 29<sup>th</sup> Khand tseejüü (T. *mkha'-gro'i tshes-bcu*), Zangad (T. *brtsan-rgod*), Dürteddagva (T. *dur-khrod-kyi bdag-po*), and Jamsran's (T. *lcam-sring*) texts are recited. There are two monks who studied in India. The monastery has a regular *jarts nyamba* meditation lasting for 108 days in the countryside.
